Temporary Leadership Team for OPAL

On Wednesday May 31st there was a follow-up meeting to discuss moving OPAL forward as a vibrant Associate group of women and men in Ohio and Pennsylvania. The meeting took place by Zoom. Those present were Conni Dubick, Dominican Sisters of Peace; Patsy Richards, Humility of Mary; Linda Haas, Tiffin Franciscans; Linda Hoefflin, Sisters of Divine Providence; Barbara Spencer, Ursuline Sisters of Youngstown; and Beth Vetter, Sisters of Charity of Nazareth. Dan Carney, The Passionists; and Mary Beth Durnell, Tiffin Franciscans, were not able to attend. Each of these people had agreed to meet to discuss the future leadership of OPAL.

We discussed the OPAL checking account which Patsy has been in charge of as Treasurer. She has moved the checking account to PNC Bank. We decided that we need a second person on record for the checking account. Patsy asked Dan to be that person and he agreed.

The discussion of a new Leadership Team was the focus of our discussion. The Leadership Team has a term of four years and those changes happen in the spring.
